

KWSC Skating Etiquette

We need your help! Let's work together to ensure the best training environment for *all* skaters.

To ensure the best training environment for each KWSC skater, we need to work together. The responsibility to educate the athletes about session etiquette is a shared one:

- **the club** sets the standard
- **the parents/guardians** educate their children about the expectations
- **the coaches** do continuous education in the daily training environment

Please review the following skating etiquette with your skater:

- Be respectful of everyone on the ice, no matter their age or level
- Soloists always have the right-of-way, to ensure visibility they are required to wear one of our high visibility vests.
- Spins not executed on the music should be practiced in centre ice
- Look both ways before leaving the side of the ice
- When finishing a spin or a jump, pay attention to skaters around you to get out of their way
- When setting out to do a spin, pay attention to where the soloist is going, so as not to get in their way
- When setting out to do a jump, make sure any skaters finishing an element in your jumping path have enough time to get out of the way
- Do not interrupt another skaters' lesson time
- Skaters are not allowed electronics on the ice
- Bungee Harnesses can only be used under the supervision of a coach
- Only coaches have access to the computer to play music
- In order to make the most out of a paid lesson, parents should not talk to skaters during their session time
- No one is allowed to film another skater without their consent

The following guidelines are not mandatory, but would go a long way into making KWSC the best training facility:

- Saying hi to everyone with a smile 😊
- Every skater thrives on cheers. If you see someone doing something good, cheer them on!
- Accidents happen. If you get in someone's way by accident, take the time to say you are sorry that happened. Everyone is trying their best out there.
